Why might this person be saying/asking this?

What seems to be their view of God/Christians/Church/Life in general etc.?

What questions(s) could I ask them?

What kind of answer might I eventually give?

Questions we could ask our friend

Why do you say that? What makes you think that? Why is this important to you?

What comes to mind when you think about God, Jesus, Christians?

How did you come to believe what you believe?

Is God morally dubious?

3) Learn to tell your story

Telling your Story

- What life was like growing up/before you came to know Christ?
- What was it that got your attention?
- What were the points of crisis AND process (most stories have both – even if you grew up in Christian home)
- Were there key bible verses (but remember to translate!)
- What difference has Jesus made to you?

Into Groups

What question(s) do you dread being asked?

Why might someone be asking this question?
What question(s) could you ask in return?
When you do respond – what might you say?
