

Cairngorms Convention Safeguarding Policy

The Cairngorms Convention accepts its responsibility to comply with the secular multi-agency safeguarding procedures relating to adults, children or vulnerable adults experiencing or at risk of harm, abuse or neglect.

The Cairngorms Convention is committed to:

- Promoting a safer environment and culture within our activities by adhering to safe working practices and acknowledging the principle that safeguarding is everyone's business.
- Making sure those involved in any way are aware of their roles and responsibilities. We will support them by providing safeguarding guidelines commensurate with their role, primarily those involved with offering prayer support after each teaching session.
- Responding promptly to every safeguarding concern or allegation in accordance with the safeguarding practice guidance.
- We will make sure that any complaint made regarding a vulnerable person, who may have been harmed or is in significant danger, will be reported immediately and we will cooperate with statutory agencies during any investigation.
- Caring for victims/survivors of abuse and other affected persons.
- We will seek to ensure that they are referred to an appropriate authority eg home church, statutory authority that recognises the importance of understanding the needs of those who have been abused, to give on-going support.
- Caring for those who are the subject of concerns or allegations of abuse and other affected persons.
- We will seek to ensure that they are referred to an appropriate authority eg home church, statutory authority that recognises the importance of understanding the needs of those who have been abused.
- Responding to those that may pose a risk to others.
- We will seek to collaborate with the statutory agencies.
